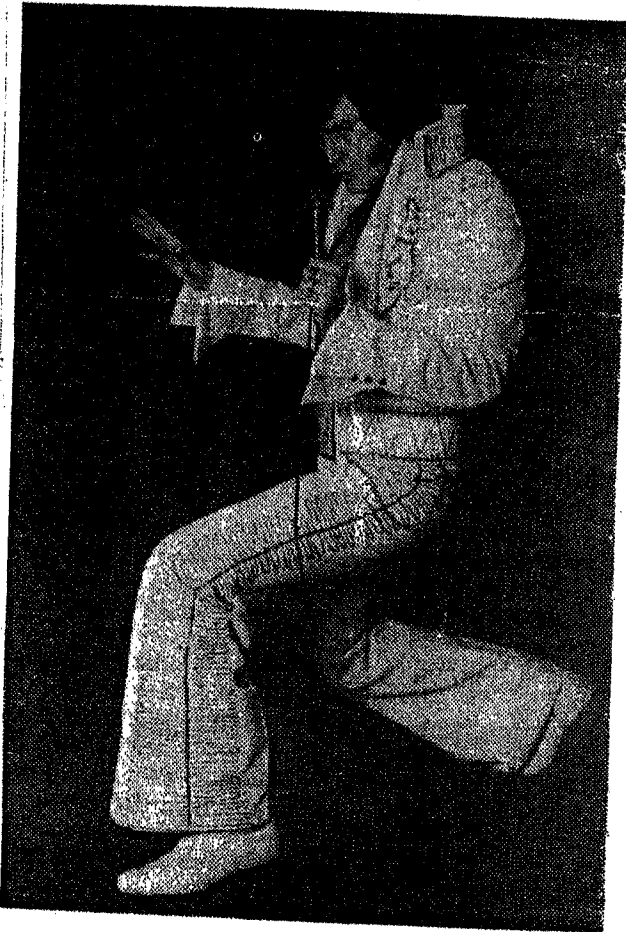

SALUTES
ELVIS**

Elvis Presley zoomed in to big-time entertainment practically overnight. Born in Tupelo, Mississippi, Elvis began singing for friends and folk gatherings when he was barely five years old. All of his training had been self-instructed and simply from hard work. At an early age, with not enough money to buy a guitar, he practiced for his future stardom by strumming on a broomstick handle. Soon he graduated to a cheap \$2.98 toy guitar and began picking out tunes...and singing on street corners.

After earning a few bucks by working at small part-time jobs, Elvis walked into a small unknown recording studio and asked to make a record...at his own expense. In just a few short weeks his first record was released and overnight a sensational star was born. *The rest is history...including his tragic death in 1977.*

Elvis Presley was the most powerful original protagonist of popular songs in the music business. His style stood out vividly on record and in personal appearance... and it is with this thought: just one hell of a performer.

that a young entertainer by the name of Ron Young has created his new show called "To Elvis, With Love".

You're sitting in the same showroom at the Hacienda Hotel, where just moments before skaters spun on Ice...but now the room feels different...there's an eerie chill.
